Senator T. W. M. Long was made chairman of the Senate Committee on Public Health by Lieut. Governor W. P. Horton Friday. In addition, the Roanoke Rapids legislator was made a member of the following Senate committees: finance; manufacturing, _labor _and _commerce; _public _welfare; conservation and development; commercial fisheries; counties, towns; trustees of the University; institutions for the blind; Caswell Training School; claims; rules; water commerce; railroads; salaries and fees; Senate expenditures.

In the House of Representatives, William D. Holoman of Weldon was appointed to the following committees: appropriations; judiciary No. 1; elections and election laws; agriculture; unemployment compensation; counties, cities and towns; public utilities; penal institutions; health; public buildings and grounds.

Ben B. Everett of Palymyra, the other Representatives from Halifax County, was appointed to the following committees: finance; agriculture, education; counties, cities and towns; insurance; manufacturing and labor; public utilities; penal institutions; public health.
