Ruby H. Cook, 32 year old employee of Halifax Paper Co., died suddenly here Sunday morning of heart failure.

He was on the morning shift from 7 until 3 and had an attack about 8 o'clock Sunday morning. A fellow employee took the fainting man to the Roanoke Rapids Hospital where he died in about 15 minutes. So far as known he had never suffered from a previous heart attack.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon from his brother's residence at Gumberry with interment in the family cemetery there. 
