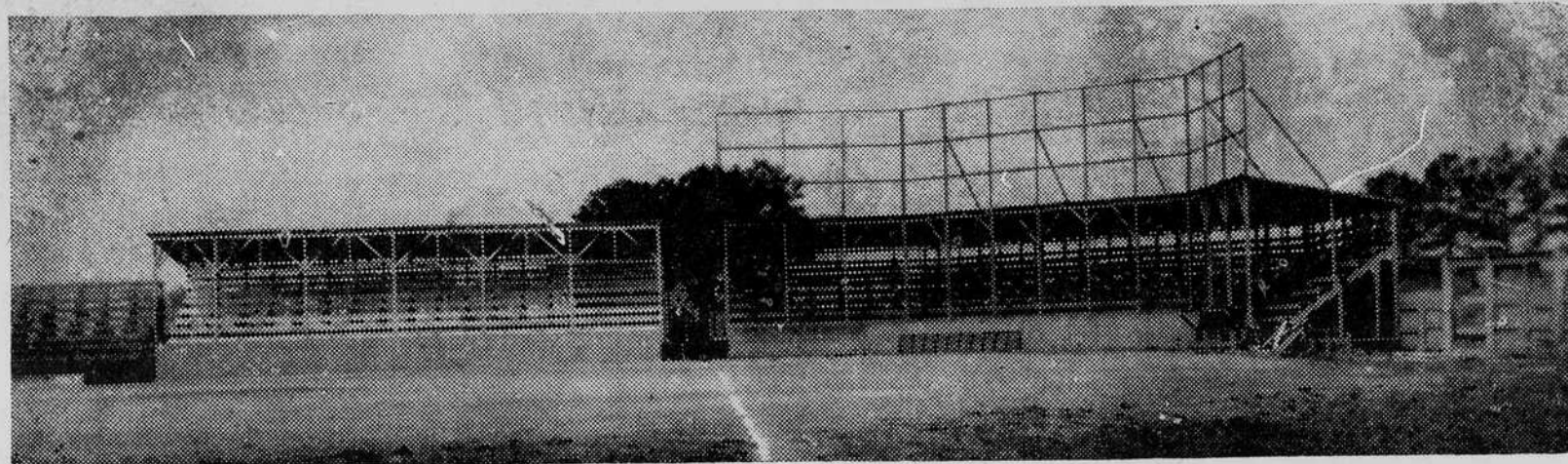

## TO CHOOSE MAYOR AND 2 MEMBERS

Notice of the regular city election to be held on Tuesday, May 2nd, when a Mayor and a Commissioner from each Ward will be elected, was approved at an adjourned meeting of the City Board of Commissioners this afternoon.

City registration books will be opened for the registration of voters, not now registered on the city books, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. starting Saturday, April 15 and closing on Saturday, April 22. On Saturdays the books will be at the polling places from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m.
