SONJA HENIE HAS STAR'S ROLE FOR WEEK'S LEAD-OFF

A completely different type of picture for Sonja Henie, "Everything Happens at Night," which will be shown at the Peoples Sunday and move to the Imperial for a two-day run, Monday-Tuesday, presents the famed skating star in a combined dramatic and comedy role. Sonja's amazingly developed acting ability is said to make her perfectly at home in the story and of course there are sequences in which Sonja disports not only on skates but on the sheer, shimmering ski slides of the Alps. Although Sonja's role is essentially dramatic, light comedy touches are injected when Ray Milland and Robert Cummings, as two rival newspaper reporters, fall for her and fight for her love as well as for one of the biggest stories of the day.

"Everything Happens at Night" is said to be exceptional entertainment.

Clair Trevor and John Wayne have the leading roles in "Allegheny Uprising" which will be shown Monday-Tuesday at Peoples Theatre.

The story concerns itself with the dramatic uprising of the Pennsylvania settlers against the British army approximately 15 years before the fateful Revolution of 1776. When indifferent army officials failed to heed the protests against crooked traders were supplying Indians with munitions, which in turn were being used in savage raids, the desperate frontiersmen openly revolted.

James Smith, portrayed by Wayne, was elected leader of the "rebels". With his faithful followers, he tried to expose the illicit traffic of the traders, but the arrogant officer in charge of Fort Loudon ignored the charges. Through the treachery of Callendar, leader of the unprincipled traders, a warrant was issued for his arrest. From this point on the tattered frontiersmen were obliged to take up arms against the British garrison, a siege that showed the Mother Country the resourcefulness and courage of the colonists which later broke the shackles of her rule.

The supporting cast includes George Sanders, Brian Donlevy, Wilfrid Lawson, Robert Barrat and others.

Pat O'Brien and Edward Arnold will be presented to their many fans in their latest picture, "Slightly Honorable," Wednesday-Thursday at Peoples Theatre. "Slightly Honorable" has just been released and has not yet been reviewed.

"Laugh It Off" will be shown Friday only, Bargain Day, at Peoples Theatre. Johnny Downs, Constance Moore, Marjorie Rambeau, Hedda Hopper, Edgar Kennedy, Janet Beecher and Cecil Cunningham form the cast.
