

COUNTY REGISTERS 6,492 MEN; CITY NO. 3 LEADS HERE

Registering in Halifax County any of the precincts. yesterday were 6,492 men. Of that The majority of the registrants Rapids township.

The total registration for the territory under the draft board No. 1 was 3,210. That territory includes the four Roanoke Rapids precincts, Weldon, Butterwood, and Littleton. Following are the figures for each of those precincts: Roanoke Rapids No. 1-470; No. 2-430; No. 3-749; No. 4-438; Weldon-668; Littleton-350; Butterwood-105.

Total registration for the lower end of the county under draft board No. 2 was 3,282.

Total registration in Northampton County was 3,093. Garysburg led in number with approximately 380. East Gaston, across river, registered 306; West Gaston 128.
