Thousands of visitors are expected for the informal opening of the store, to be held from 7 to 10 o'clock Friday night, after which they will open for business Saturday. The building was erected by J. Winfield Crew, local attorney. McCrory Stores Corp., operating over 200 5-10-25c stores over the Nation, occupy the 75 x 140-ft. street floor for sales space, with full basement underneath for storage. Eleven modern apartments are located on the second floor.

The store is said to be one of the most scientifically arranged in this section of the state, and is fully air-conditioned.
