

PROFIT-SHARING BILL INTRODUCED BEFORE ASSEMBLY

Two new bills relating to Halifax County were introduced in the General Assembly late last week. House Bill 774, introduced by Allsbrook and Everett, was to provide for municipalities in the county to share in the profit from liquor sales.

The Senate Bill provides for the fixing of the salaries of the Judge and Solicitor of the Recorder's Court and the Special Deputy Clerk of the Superior Court Acting Clerk of the Recorder's Court.

The House Bill, the major contents of which were agreed upon at a meeting of County Commissioners and representatives from several municipalities in the county together with the three legislators from the County in Raleigh last week, provides for the municipalities in the county, with the exception of Littleton, to receive 17 per cent of the net profits from the ABC Stores within the respective towns or cities.

Settlement is to be made the first Monday in July, 1941, and quarterly thereafter.

Littleton is to receive only such part of the 17 per cent as it receives from the Warren County ABC Store operated in Littleton.

All ABC profits in Halifax county to be used exclusively for debt service.

The bill passed second reading in the House on March 8, as amended to require municipal net profit from Halifax County ABC store sales to go into debt service.

Senate Bill 242, introduced by E. L. Travis, would fix the salary of Judge of Recorder's Court at \$1,800 yearly; Solicitor at \$1,500; and Clerk at \$1,380.

Action of other bills was as follows: Senate Bill 215, fixing salary of Clerk of Superior Court and Register of Deeds, passed second and third reading on March 5 as amended to make salary increases effective on April 1 instead of March 1; House Bill 210, for Scotland Neck elections, enrolled and ratified, March 4; House Bill 310, Halifax tax collectors, enrolled and ratified March 4.

er spoke without bringing intelligence to the discussion.

So, while usefulness was not determined upon position or even power, the Allsbrook rating was made on the importance to which he put his speaking power. He was a hard worker in all the committee assignments which he drew and there was no difficulty among the scribes and the chatters when they came to appraise the personalities before them. There was no concert of action. Each ballott was independently and secretly cast.

It was the Allsbrook speech on the newly constituted Welfare Boards in the state, a greatly controverted issue, which appeared to have silenced the opposition Wednesday when that bill passed without any votes against it. And more than any other House member, he has been credited with sparing the State that referendum demanded by the united dry forces.

MISSING FARMER FOUND SHOT DEAD

The body of Luther L. Murray, 34, tenant farmer of Nash County, was found Wednesday lying in the woods near Flood's Chapel Cross Roads.

He had been slain with a shotgun found near his body. A coroner's jury, acting under Coroner M. C. Gulley, returned a verdict that he met death at his own hands.

Deputy Sheriff J. R. Tanner said the shotgun load entered Murray's head at the joint of his chin. The man had been missing from his home since Sunday night.

Funeral services will be held at 3 p.m. Thursday at Samaria Church, conducted by the Rev. A. D. Parrish of Zebulon.

Survivors are his wife, the former Norma Morgan; five children, Marie, Richard, Janice, Coleman, and Thomas Murray, all of Nash County; his mother, Mrs. Alice Murray of Halifax; and several brothers and sisters.

W. J. Murray, who is employed at the Halifax Paper Company here, left today to attend the funeral of the deceased. The paper company employee lives near Hollister. He has been working here only a short while.

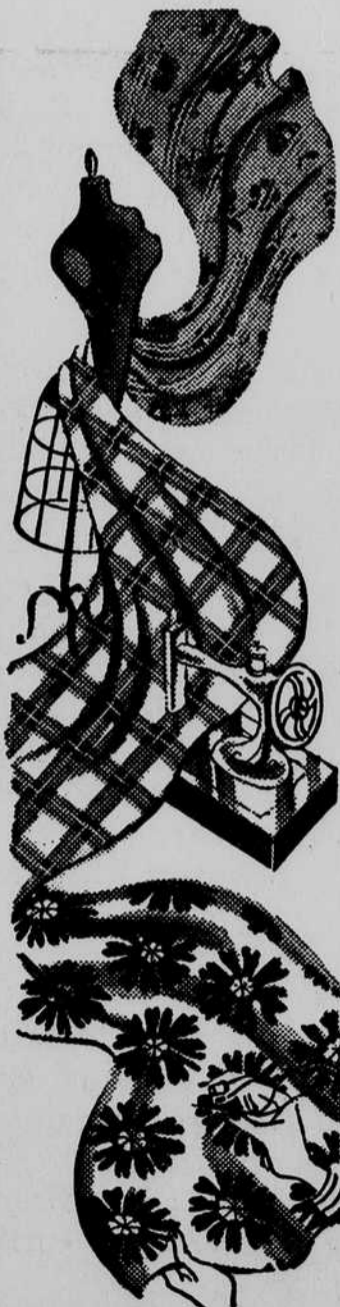

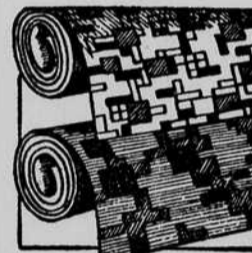
