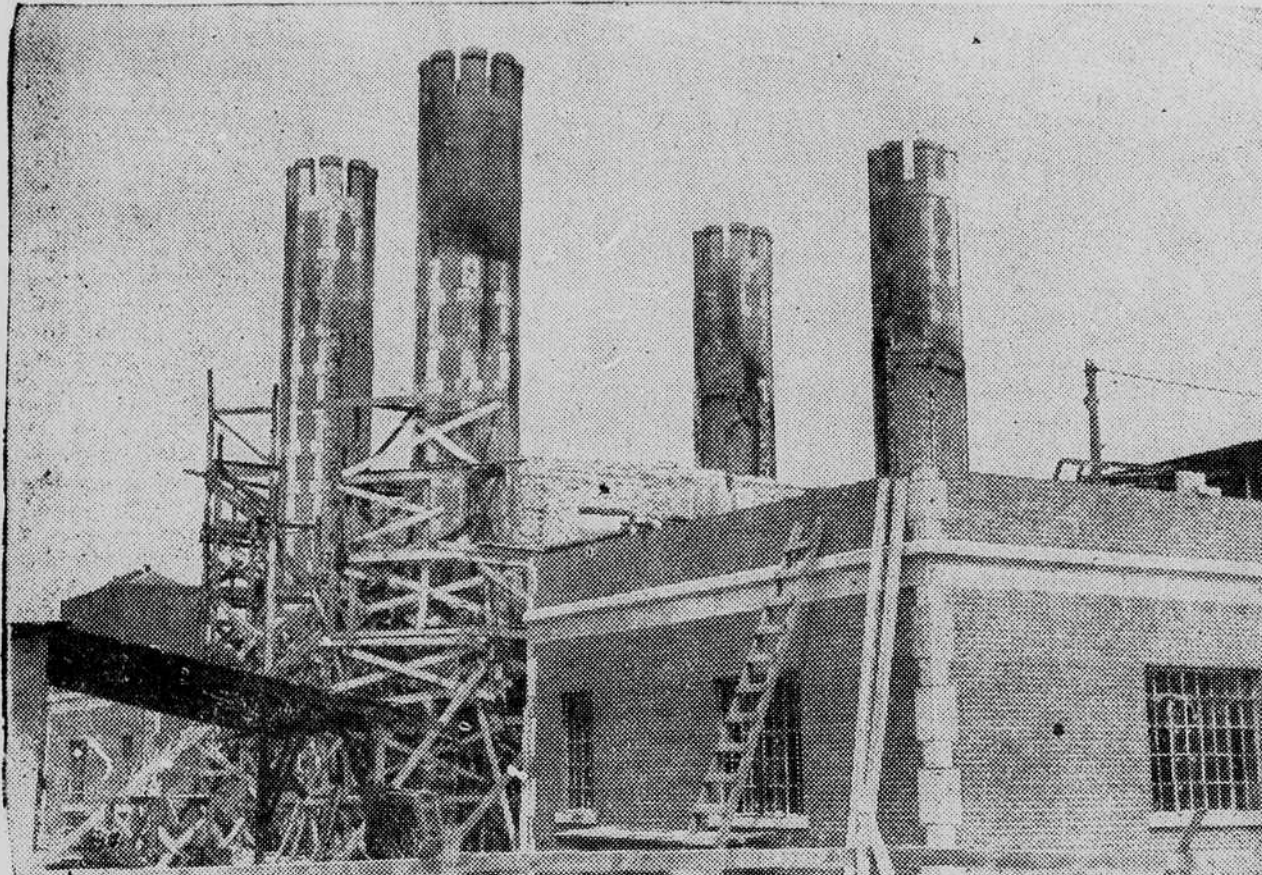


AS ARMORY GOES DOWN

Will Attend Institute At Chapel Hill

Officials of city halls and county court houses in this area have been invited to join with other city, county and state officials of North Carolina in attending the fifth biennial institute for the interpretation and discussion of laws of the 1941 General Assembly and National Congress to be held at the Institute of Government in Chapel Hill Saturday, May 24, it was announced today by Albert Coates, Director of the Institute. A. E. Akers, city tax collector, plans to represent the city.

In addition to the discussion of the laws particularly affecting cities and towns, counties and the State, with special reference to the coordination of city, county, state and federal governmental units in national defense, the gathering will also celebrate the 10th anniversary of the founding of the Institute of Government.

Registration and group meetings are scheduled for 12 o'clock noon Saturday, May 24, at the Institute of Government building. Following a luncheon session in the University dining hall, discussions of the state and national laws will be led by Governor J. Melville Broughton, members of the General Assembly, other prominent State officials, and members of the Institute of Government staff.

Saturday night an interpretation and discussion of laws of the national Congress affecting cities and towns, counties, and the State as a whole will be led by Congressman John W. McCormack of Massachusetts, majority leader in the national House of Representatives, together with members of the North Carolina Congressional delegation.

Following the session there will be a reception in Graham Memorial in honor of Congressman McCormack, Governor Broughton, North Carolina representatives in the National Congress and the State Assembly, and visiting state and local officials.

Governor Broughton will present certificates to law enforcing officers who will have completed a seven-day training course which is to open at the Institute of Government Sunday, May 18, and continue throughout the week.

University of North Carolina students from cities and counties in this Congressional district will extend invitations to local officials to attend the celebration, and will provide rooms in dormitories and

fraternity houses for those wishing to stay overnight.
