The Canada Goose Flocks, aggregating many thousands, of these great grey birds spend the winter on Lake Mattathough the habitat of he Canada Goose with us is not so restricted as that of the whistlng Swan, large numbers of the former wintering all down our coast line from Currituck Sound to the southwest corner of the Pamlico Sound, with many scatering flocks to be found on the ower sounds, Lake Ellis and other suitable bodies of water. They also occur in some numbers for many niles up the valley of the Yadkin River. They seem to be equally t nome on both fresh and salt vater. Of course, none of the geese ecure their food by diving, taking heir ell-grass or other suitable ood directly from the bottom in omparatively shallow water. They uso feed to a certain extent on and, a winter wheat field provng an acceptable area for seuring nourishment. Many of these geese nest withthe borders of the United tates, contrary to the habits of ther members of the group that est only in the far north. In ome sections, trees seem to be avored as nesting sites rather an the ground, this being partiularly true of the Reelfoot Lake gion. The loud "honking" cry of this ecies is one of its noticeable naracteristics.
