# N ASSAULTS GIRL

### **GOVERNOR TAKES HAND IN WRECK CASE**

#### **MEN ARE** TRIED IN HALIFAX

#### **Woman Reports Accident To** Broughton

Governor J. M. Broughton took a hand in bringing to justice three men involved in an automobile accident in Halifax County this week, and shortly thereafter they were tried in the county recorder's court on various charges.

The automobile in which the men-David Hobbs, Harry Gupton and Edward Haithcock-were riding struck an automobile driven by the chauffeur of R. B. Young of Henderson on the detour beween Roanoke Rapids and Littleton Monday afternoon. Young's car was being driven by Junius Heser, enroute from Henderson to Emporia, Va., with Mrs. Young, ner three children, and a Negro maid, Annie Burdette.


Young's automobile was turned over by the collision, and Heser climbed from the car and approached the one of the white nen, which had gone into a ditch. The three resented Hester's atempt to read their license plate, which had apparently been bent n the collision, and there were vords between them and Hester. Quite a bit of profanity was used y the men, it was reported.

Mrs. Young then walked up, and fter a heated argument between ier and the white men she alegedly was roughly shoved away when she tried to get the license umber. Hobbs, Gupton, and Haithock then pushed their car from he ditch and drove away.

The woman phoned Governor broughton as soon as possible afer the incident, and complained f the treatment she had received rom the motorist. The Governor nen called the State Highway Parol radio station near Raleigh to et officers on the trail of the iree men.

In the meantime, however, Sherf H. A. House of Halifax County ad started an investigation upon iformation received. Mrs. Young ad gotten the first three numers of the license plate on the othcar, and Sheriff House traced ie car as a machine licensed at enderson. He contacted the Highay patrol there, and was told officers suspected the guilty arties. It was reported that three nidentified women of this city ipplied the last three numbers the license plate which clinched case against the three men.

Part of the damage done by five white men to the Riverside Inn and filling station just across Roanoke River from here in Gaston Township of Northampton County can be seen in the above photograph, which shows window panes broken when the men threw beer bottles through them after taking beer from the station against the wishes of the proprietor who refused to sell it to them because of their drunken condition. Tried in the Northampton County recorder's court at Jackson the "raiders", one of whom was shot in the shoulder with a rifle when the operator of the place tried to protect the property, drew suspended sentences. They agreed to reimburse the proprietor for damage to the station, and the beer they drank.

#### APPEAL Case Is Aired In Recorder's **Court Tuesday**

MEDLIN

**ENTERS** 

C. E. Medlin, local white man, was sentenced to 12 months on the roads in the county recorder's court at Halifax on Tuesday by Judge C. R. Daniel for assulting his daughter, Minnie Medlin, 19, after the two had an argument over a woman whom Medlin allegedly had been living in the same house with for several months.

Judgment in the case was suspended upon good behavior for 12 months, during which time he is not to see the other woman, Edna Mayton, who has left Roanoke Rapids according to reports today.

Medlin appealed from the sentence imposed by the recorder, and the case is scheduled to be tried at the next term of Superior Court which begins August 11. He was placed under a \$175 bond for his appearance in Superior Court.

According to testimony at the trial in the county recorder's court, Medlin and his daughter had an argument on June 21, during which she told him that he thought more "of somebody else" than he did her. He denied her statement and slapped her, she said, and when she repeated the charge he whipped her with a belt. The warrent charged him with assaulting her with a leather strap on her body.
