The first series of merit examinations given in North Carolina covered only the employees of the Unemployment Compensation Commission. Four thousand six hundred and ninety seven persons were found to have the minimum qualifications and took 11,877 examinations for clerical positions. For the present series it is estimated that some 12,500 applications will be made and that some 10,000 of these will be accepted.
