

NEGRO IS HELD AS RESULT OF ROAD FATALITY

Henry Mills Killed; Driver Of Car Held

Jack Pearson, Negro, is being held in the Northampton County jail at Jackson in connection with the death of Henry Mills, Jackson Negro, who was killed in an automobile accident Sunday night about 8:30 o'clock.

Mills was fatally injured when the automobile Pearson was driving overturned near the entrance to the Moeffield Farm between Jackson and Weldon. The men were enroute to Weldon when the accident happened. It was reported here that the car ran off the highway onto the dirt shoulder, for some reason or other overturned to break Mills' neck, and he died almost instantly. The car landed right side up after turning over.

Pearson, who was not seriously hurt, is charged with careless and reckless driving while under the influence of an intoxicating beverage, or drug, and causing the death of Mills.

NOTICE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF ROANOKE RAPIDS that it shall be unlawful to operate a music slot machine or piccalo in any sore, filling station, cafe or other place of business in the corporate limits of the City of Roanoke Rapids within a distance of 600 feet from any occupied dwelling house; provided further that this provision shall not apply to stores, cafes or other places of business within the fire zone.

Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be fined \$10.00 for each and every offense.

This ordinance shall be effective October 1, 1941.
