The meeting was presided over by Theodore Ray, president of the 4-H County council, who gave the address of welcome.

Most interesting part of the program was the illustrated lecture given by Mrs. W. M. Parham of the Tillery Home Demonstration Club. Mrs. Parham has traveled extensively in South Africa, and she told club members what form their project work would have to take should they live in that part of the world. Mrs. Parham brought work baskets, towels, quilt squares, aprons, pictures, handicraft articles to show the 4-H Club members the work of the South African.

"Native, wild life and agricultural habits, as well as living conditions were forcefully portrayed. This is one lecture that 4-H'ers will always remember. At the close of her lecture Mrs. Parham spoke a few words in the native language, which was very amusing.

## Monday Bridge

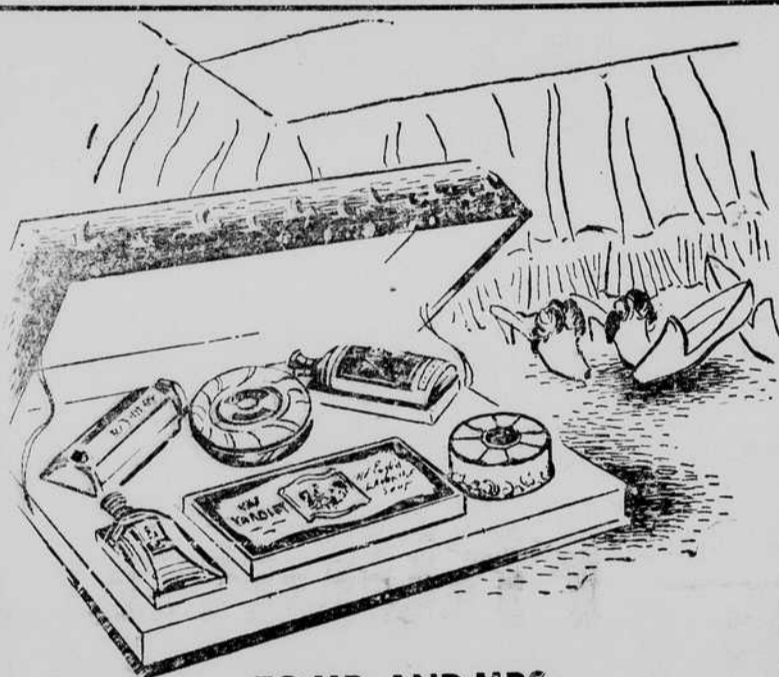

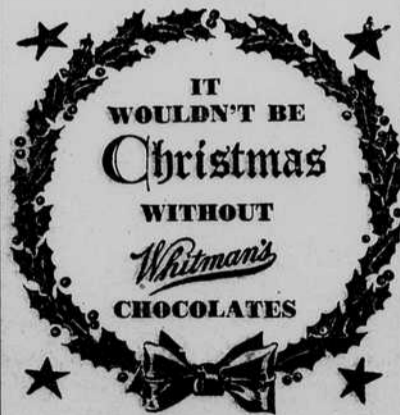

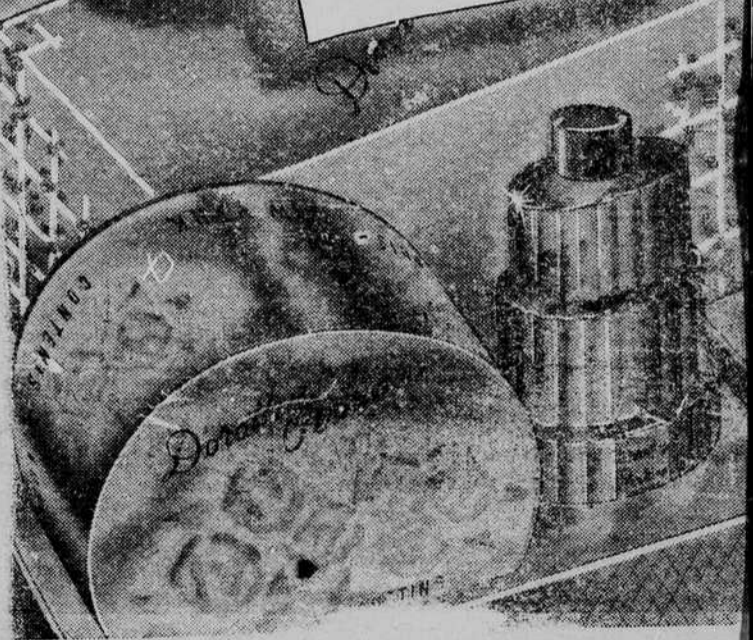
