Roanoke Rapids voters will go to the polls on Tuesday, January 27th, to decide on two important issues affecting the future welfare of the city. On that day a special election will be held and the question submitted to the voters as to whether they will approve the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$16,000. to finance the proposed underpass at the Seaboard Airline Railway tracks, and bonds in the amount of \$12,000. for purchasing land and improving same for cemetery purposes.
