HALIFAX CO-OP MEETING

Halifax County stockholders and patrons of the Farmers Cooperative Exchange and members of the Cotton Association will gather in the County Agricultural Building in Halifax on Thursday, March 19, at 2:30 o'clock for their annual joint meeting.

Principal speaker at the session will be M. G. Mann, general manager of both the North Carolina Cotton Growers Cooperative Association and the Farmers Cooperative Exchange, who will report on the past years' operations of both cooperatives. In addition a complete report on the operations of the Halifax FCX Service will be given.
