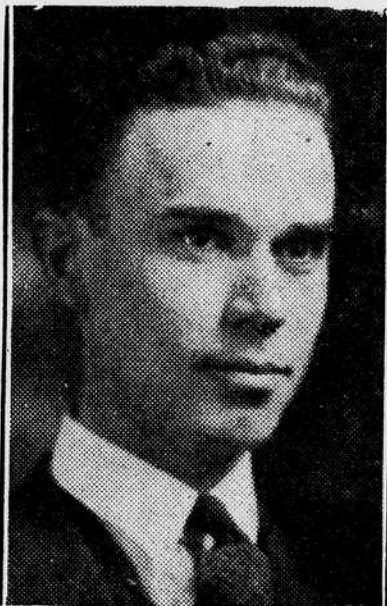

COUNTY, STATE RACES

Polls Open 6:30,
Close 6:30 P.M.
By War Time

Democratic voters in Halifax County will go to the polls Saturday to nominate candidates for a number of county offices and to vote on only one State-wide contest, that in which Senator Josiah Bailey is seeking another term in the United States Senate in opposition to Richard T. Fountain of Rocky Mount.

County offices to be voted on include: One seat in the State Senate, one seat in the House of Representatives, Clerk of Superior Court, Sheriff, five members of the Board of County Commissioners, and Judge of Recorders Court.

Polls at the various polling places will open promptly at 6:30 a.m., Eastern War Time, and close at 6:30 p.m., Eastern War Time, according to S. W. Dickens, Chairman of the County Board of Elections.

Registrars and judges of election have been requested by Chairman Dickens to be at the polls at least by 6 o'clock on the morning of election day so that
