The services were conducted by Rev. W. F. Walters and Rev. C. E. Crawford. Interment followed in the Stephenson Burial ground nearby.

Mrs. Millikin was a daughter of the late James H. Twisdale and Lucy Poythress Twisdale of Warren County. She had spent practically her entire life in Halifax County, and was an active and life-long member of the Halifax Methodist Church.
