Every man realized the importance of the mission and was day furlough here with relatives "eager to get a crack at em." The invasion fleet arrived off Sicily after dark, the BRISTOL being with the van. At first the enemy offered stiff resistance both with air attacks and coastal batteries, but by morning all of the enemy's guns had been silenced Our objective surrendered in the early forenoon. That's all there was to it, with the exception of a few light air raids in the following days.


