METTS TO BE

That Roanoke Rapids stands a fair chance to ave a Home Guard Unit e.ablished here appeared imminent tonight as city officials, civic club leaders and other interested citizens are preparing to be hosts tomorrow (Friday) to General J. B. Van Metts and General Jenkins, who will visit the city on a sort of "inspection tour" to decide where to establish such a unit.

It has been learned from an authentic source that Roanoke Rapids is one of three cities in Eastern Carolina which is being favorably regarded by General Van Metts for the establishment of a home guard, and a decision will undoubtedly be forthcoming from his office within a few days after his visit iere tomorrow.

General Van Metts is the Adjutant General of the State of North Carolina, as well as the head of the selective service in the state. His visit to inspect the local Armory, as well as acquaint himself with local conditions, has been looked forward to for some time, and local citizens are highly hopeful that a Home Guard unit may be established here as a result of his tour of inspection.

Immediately upon arrival in the city he will confer with Major Kelly Jenkins, following which he will meet with other city officials and citizens interested in the formation of a home guard unit here, and will later be a guest at a luncheon in his honor at a local restaurant.

Full defails of the decision of tomorrow's meeting will be carried in next week's issue of the Herald.
