The bar-bending feat can be performed in any manufacturing



plant where electrical precision instruments are used.

The bar is laid across a pair of blocks and the would-be Atlas steps up and planks his smallest pinkie firmly down upon it. Presto, an ultra-sensitive electrical device records a "bend" of one five-thousandth of an inch in the metal.

Such devices are used to check the accuracy of high precision gauges to within a fraction of one ten-thousandth of an inch.
