Premeasurement Tobacco Acreage Been Provided

In order to speed up final measurement of tobacco acreage in Halifax County, and to give the farmer the benefit of knowing that he has not planted in excess of his allotment, premeasurement has been provided, C. L. Kelly, chairman, Halifax County AAA Committee, announced today. "Qualified persons have been approved and are now available to do this work at only a small cost to the farm operator," he said. Kelly pointed out that premeasurement dimensions found to be correct will be used in the final check after planting. Since there is such a brief time between planting and harvesting, he urged all farmers to take advantage of this service so that final acreages may be determined on all farms and sales cards prepared for issuance by the time the markets open.
