The young negro told Deputy Sheriff C. O. Strickland who arrested him, that his father came home late Saturday night and began abusing his mother, finally getting her down on the floor and choking her.

Paying no attention to his son's plea to leave his mother alone, Alston continued choking his wife. The boy, it is said, then seized an ax and struck his father two heavy blows on the head. He died as a result of a fractured skull, Coroner Rowe announced.

Further investigation into the killing by Sheriff H. A. House, Deputy J. L. Mountcastle and Coroner Rowe brought forth practically the same story from other members of the family who witnessed the slaying.
