

Marine Recruiter Here on Tuesday

The District of Raleigh Marine Recruiting office has just announced that there will be a Marine Recruiting Sergeant in the Post Office Building in Roanoke Rapids on Tuesday of each week during the month of August. The Sergeant will be here to interview men between the ages of 17 and 30 who are interested in enlisting in the U. S. Marine Corps or the Air Corps units.

Enlistment periods are for two, three, or four years for general duty and for three or four years for duty with the Air Corps units.

Men who enlist prior to October 31 will be eligible for all the benefits of the G. I. Bill of Rights the office stated.

Men who enlist, after about eight weeks of recruit training, are guaranteed a 10 day furlough before going assigned to a regular duty station, aboard a ship of the U. S. Fleet, or at any of the many interesting foreign stations where Marines serve.

The Marine Corps Institute offers free vocational and educational opportunities to all men serving in the Corps.

The Sergeant will be in the Post Office from 8:00 a. m., until 4:30 p. m., each Tuesday during the month of August.

All men, who are interested in the Marine Corps, are invited to visit the office for any information they might desire.

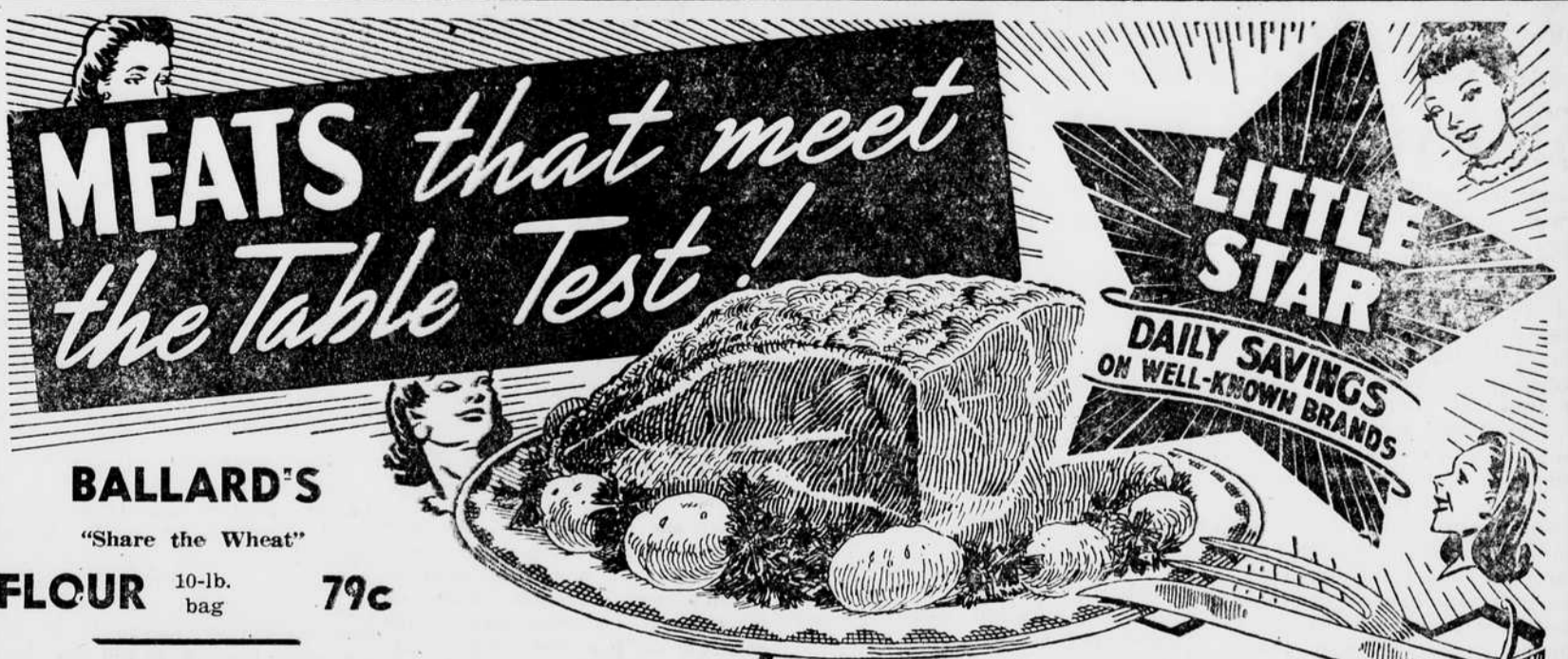
