Department stores expect current shortages in "desirable" men's wear - clothing and shirts - to continue for at least the next six months. Rumors of nylons at 72 cents on northern markets brought the explanation here that they were "seconds" or "thirds." "We could have had plenty of nylons here, too, for a price," one merchant said meaningfully.

Nylons, not in plenty, but in greater quantities, are expected to be readily available in six months.

Radios, small tables, chairs, electric irons, toasters and other small electrical goods were in heavy demand. An almost adequate supply was available for the first time since 1940.


