ment service divisions of the employment security commission was announced today by the North Carolina Merit System office.

Veterans are entitled to ten points preference to be added to their examination grades.

The fall examination program will begin on September 20. Applications will be obtained from the Merit System office in Durham along with bulletins giving minimum qualifications required, duties and salary range for all positions.

Registers established as a result of examination will be used to fill existing vacancies throughout the state with employment security and employment service divisions of Employment Security Commission and statistical vacancies with all agencies under the Merit System.

Examinations will be given for the following series of positions: Managers and interviewers, training series, administrative assistants, legal series, claims deputy series, claims examiners, field series, publicity specialists, veterans' employment representatives, statistical series.

Applications in order to be considered for this examination must be filed on official application form and mailed to "Merit System Office, box 2328, Durham, N. C.," no later than September 2.

All veterans applying for Merit System exams are requested to indicate that they are veterans when requesting applications. They will receive a state veterans preference form to complete and return with photostat of honorable discharge.

Tentative Allocation Of \$105,515.89 Under Pittman-Robertson Act

Washington - The Fish and Wildlife Service said today a tentative allocation of \$105,515.89 has been made to North Carolina for this year under the Pittman-Robertson act.

The act provides that the receipts from the excise tax on arms and ammunition shall be returned to the states to be used, with matching funds, to acquire land for public hunting or game refuges, restocking and game and wildlife research.

North Carolina will be expected to put up 25 per cent of the total of the federal funds. The total indicated by the figures may be increased if national receipts from the tax run over the \$9,000,000 estimated total.

Last year only \$2,000,000 was distributed to states under the Robert-Pittman act, but in his final report as chairman of the Select House Committee on conservation of Wildlife, Senator Willis Robertson (D., Va.) recommended that \$5,000,000 be distributed this year.

The appropriation bill did not contain a definite figure but provided that all of this year's receipts, which had been estimated at \$5,000,000 should be available for distribution. Increased interest in hunting, along with higher prices being charged for guns and ammunition, had boosted the receipts to nearly twice the expected total.

Senator Robertson pointed out that none of the Pittman-Robertson funds may be used for development of fishing but he said that a bill to provide funds for this purpose, introduced by Rep. Dingel (D., Mich.) was favorably reported to the House recently.

The bill failed of passage under the one-object rule in the closing days of the session but remains on the calendar and can be brought up again next year.

Miss Raynor, the daughter of Mrs. H. F. Ward of Weldon, is in the 11th grade at Weldon High School and is president of the school's Hi-Tri Club.

Miss Moody, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Moody of Siler City, is 16 years old and attends the Siler City High School where she has received among other honors, a medal for her efforts in recitation contests.

The "Girls' Nation" lasted five days beginning last Saturday. They also participated in sight-seeing in Washington and vicinity.
