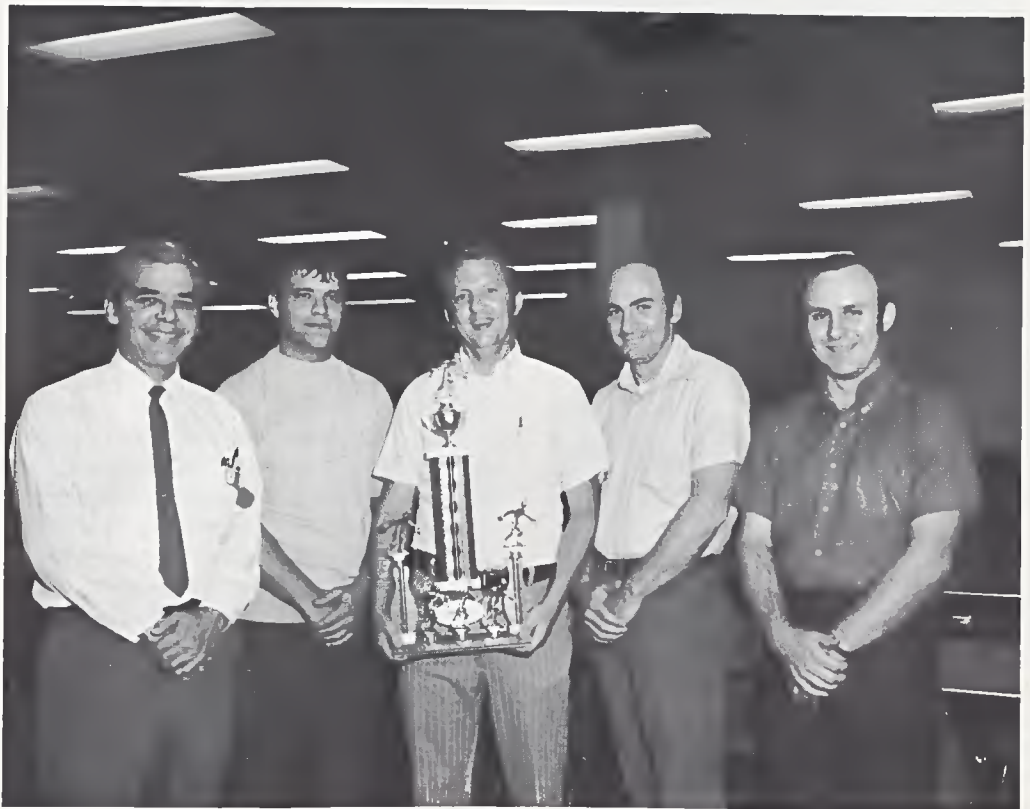
New officers, elected for the 1972-73 season, are Steve Smith (President), Claude Young (Vice President), and Chan Taylor (Secretary-treasurer).
