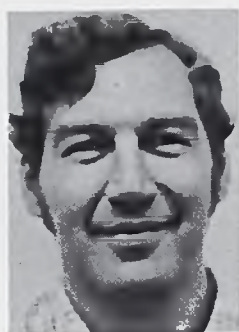
Jim Tells About The Job
