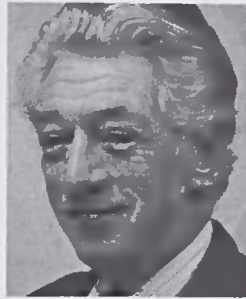


LONG SERVICE — ANNIVERSARIES

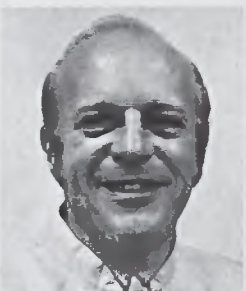

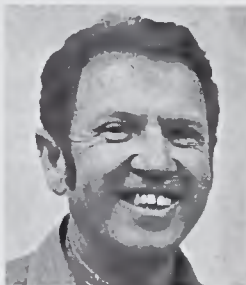

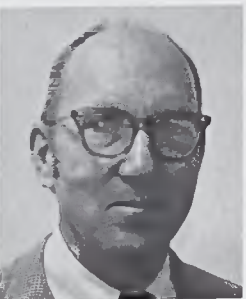
"Don" Donald L. Lewis who retired this year is also a member of the 25 year club. See Retirement article.



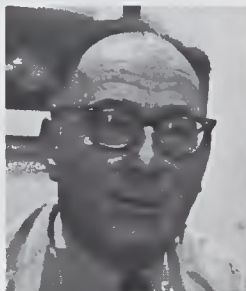
