Goal was again kicked.

In the last quarter the two teams saw-sawed up and down the field without scoring. Greensboro made gains at will through Durham's line but line plunges will not carry a team from one end of the field to the opposite goal when only a few minutes are left to play. In all these line plunges Daniel was outstanding player smashing through the opposing line with pile-driving force. Neal Jones made two of the most beautiful runs of the day. In one he carried a punt from the twenty-yard line to the center of the field.

Durham, several times throughout the game, came within a few feet of our goal but Rabenborst's Braves braced and snuffed out Durham's hopes. Greensboro was handicapped by being twice penalized for hurdling.

"1921", the date of its adoption, inscribed underneath. The shield is divided into four sections. The Lamp of Knowledge, the Trident, Mercury's slipper and a gate are placed on the shield, one in each section. The only object which needs explanation is the gate. Greensboro is called Gate City and by suggestion of our principal, Mr. Phillips, the Gate City idea is therefore carried out on the standard ring as it is carried out in cheering.

On each side of the ring is a pair of wings with "G. H. S." in one pair and the year of graduation in the other. The ring is handsome and unusual, and it is to be hoped it will be adopted by the classes.
