again went over the line, this time by right tackle. Mallory failed to kick goal.

Greensboro took the kick on the 20-yard line and went back up field for 12 yards. Three trials netted 5 yards and a punt put the ball in Charlotte's hand on the 50-yard line. Milstead took the punt for a 40-yard run, but the referee called him back on account of an infraction of rules and put the ball in play on the 40-yard line. It was Greensboro's ball on Charlotte's 40-yard line, with it first down. Three trials got but 6 yards, but another effort moved the line up. A forward pass netted 1 yard, and two other short passes added 61-2 yards. Greensboro was then held for downs.

Charlotte took the ball. Four trials got 28 yards, and a forward pass failed. Charlotte fumbled and the ball went over. Greensboro got 5 yards in three trials, then punted a foozle for 10 yards, which Greensboro recovered for first down. After two failures, Greensboro punted 25 yards, and Millstead brought the ball back to the line of scrimmage. Here the half ended with the ball in Charlotte's possession on Greensboro's 40-yard line.

Third quarter—Charlotte took the kick on her 20-yard line and ran the ball up 18 yards. Three trials made a first down, then Greensboro held for downs the next time and took the ball. Four efforts failed to get 10 yards and the ball went over. Charlotte got 10 yards in three downs. After two trials at the line, a pass was tried, which Greensboro intercepted for no gain. Greensboro took 8 yards, then punted to Charlotte's 33-yard line. Charlotte failed to make first down and the ball went over.

Greensboro made first down, then failed the next time, with the ball going over. The quarter ended with the ball in Charlotte's possession on Greensboro's 32-yard line.

Fourth quarter-Charlotte punted out of bounds on Greensboro's 45-yard line. Greensboro made first down in one effort. Then followed with another first down in three trials. Another effort put Greensboro in Charlotte's 30-yard line for the first time, Greensboro fumbled and it was Charlotte's ball on her 12-yard line. A punt put the ball on the 34-yard line.
