A. aid one of the finest of wild-flower collections, and taking care of and constantly transplanting shrubbery are only a few of the many and varied tasks which J. T. Seawell, superintendent of grounds for the 20 schools in this district, has performed here.

Mr. Seawell has taken particular interest since his occupation of this newly-created position last July, in the fight against plant diseases. Explaining that careless brushing against a plant may kill it or transplant germs from one shrub to another, Mr. Seawell asks that all students help him by using the shrubs for beauty spots instead of footstools.

Plant Plans

"G. H. S. could be as attractive a school as there is anywhere," con-

cluded Mr. Seawell, after explaining his future plans last week. These plans include screening off of the school on all sides by cedars and dogwood, obtaining a smooth lawn around the school, and improving or replanting the box woods along the main walk.
