Lt. George M. Causey, our own Miss Mozelle Causey's brother, a former Senior high lad and a battery commander on the Anzio beachhead, has recently written his brother describing experiences there.

Lieutenant Causey received the Purple Heart for the following incident as he modestly describes it:

"Not long ago I was at the entrance of one of my officer's dugouts when a large shell hit the dugout. They dug us out and luckily no one was badly hurt. I was in the hospital several days, but it was nothing serious. A few scratches, concussion, and bruised up a little. Got a Purple Heart to add to my campaign ribbon."

Lieutenant Causey adds: "Our first days in here were really rugged. All we had was a map and we had to find our positions in the dark. One morning after moving way up in the dark, we woke up staring an 88 mm. gun right in the puss! He pinned us down all day, but when darkness came we beat it—and fast."
