Looking at Sports

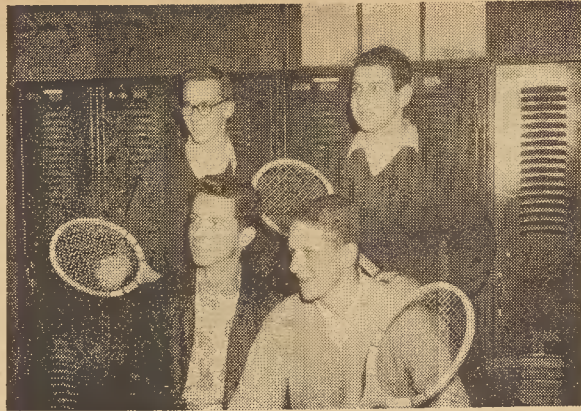
