Seniors were photographed first, starting Monday, September 10, followed by the juniors and sophomores. The photographers took approximately 240 pictures a day, which took the annual staff, headed by Jane McLennon and Kay Wood, co-editors, nearly two hours each day to plan the appointments. The studios charged each student one dollar for four proofs.

Senior girls were draped in the pictures same as last year, and junior and sophomore girls wore dark sweaters with pearls. All the boys donned their suits and ties to be photographed.

Contracts have already been signed by the presidents of the various clubs and organizations at Senior High, who want a page or a picture in the annual.
