Dodson, Nance, Burwell, Hubner Star As Whirlie Swimmers Reign Victorious

With a quartet of Ranny Dodson, bob Hubner leading the way, the Senior High swimming team has rolled over four high school op-ponents as this article goes to

ponents as this article goes to press. Raleigh, Myers Park, High Point, and Chapel Hill are the latest additions to the tankmen's victory string. The meet with Chapel Hill High was the 13th straight meet the team has won in high school competition. The aforementioned quartet has made itself famous by setting

many individual and relay records. Just two weeks ago these boys combined their efforts in the 240 yard medley relay to set an un-official national high school record. The old mark for this event was 2-17.6; their time was 2:16.4. This time becomes official only after the national record bureau approves it

approves it, Boys Claim National Records Dodson, swimming butterfly; Burwell, breaststroke; Nance, backstroke; and Hubner, freestyle; now claim the national record for the 160 yard medley relay also. Their time for this event is also up for the approval of the national board board.

In the sphere of the fractional board. Individually, all four members of the relay teams have set rec-ords this year. Dodson holds the national butterfly mark at 1:00.1. Nance holds state records in the 100 yard backstroke, 120 yard in-dividual medley, and 150 yard individual medley. Hubner has copped the state record for the 40 yard freestyle, and Burwell claims top honors in 100 yard freestyle. **Post All-American Time** Every one of these boys has posted a time comparable to All-American times last year. 
At present the swimming team practices in the Central YMCA pool.
