Dear Mr. Routh
In the last few days I have been by the Brooks School, Senior High School and Faiser School several times during the ciay, and I am extremely concerned over the pedestrian and automobile traffic during the rush hours. I feel that this is one of the most hazardous localities in Greensboro as far as pedestrians are concerned. I have no desire to be unduly severe on any one. however, the situation is one which can only be dealt with severely.
1 would appreciate it very much if you would advise the students in Senior High School that traffice violations occurring in or near the school area during the rush periods will receive stern treatment in court, including license revocation for any traffic offence which endangers other people. I am very much afraid that strict enforcement and severe penalties will be the only way we can avert tragedy during this school year. Plaese impress on the student body that they are not being singled out for special treatment which is not afforded other citizens in Greensboro, for everyone will be treated the same way, but they are more closely associated with the problems thev will feel the brunt of this action.
This is not a crusade against anyone-but an effort to save lives
