



## SCHEDULE FOR EXAMS

First semester exams will begin on Tuesday, January 19, and continue through Friday, January 22.

Registration of regular students will take place Monday, January 25. Seniors will register at 8:45; juniors, at 10:00; and sophomores at 1:00 that afternoon. Honor roll students will register Friday, January 22 at 1:00 p.m.

Miss Mildred Maddox, English teacher, must be notified by January 8 of any exemptions. A senior, or gold star wearer, may have one exemption if four majors are being taken and if five majors are being taken he is entitled to two exemptions. A junior, or silver star wearer, may have one exemption if taking four majors. This is providing he has made the honor roll all report periods during his sophomore year. There will be no sophomores allowed exemptions.
