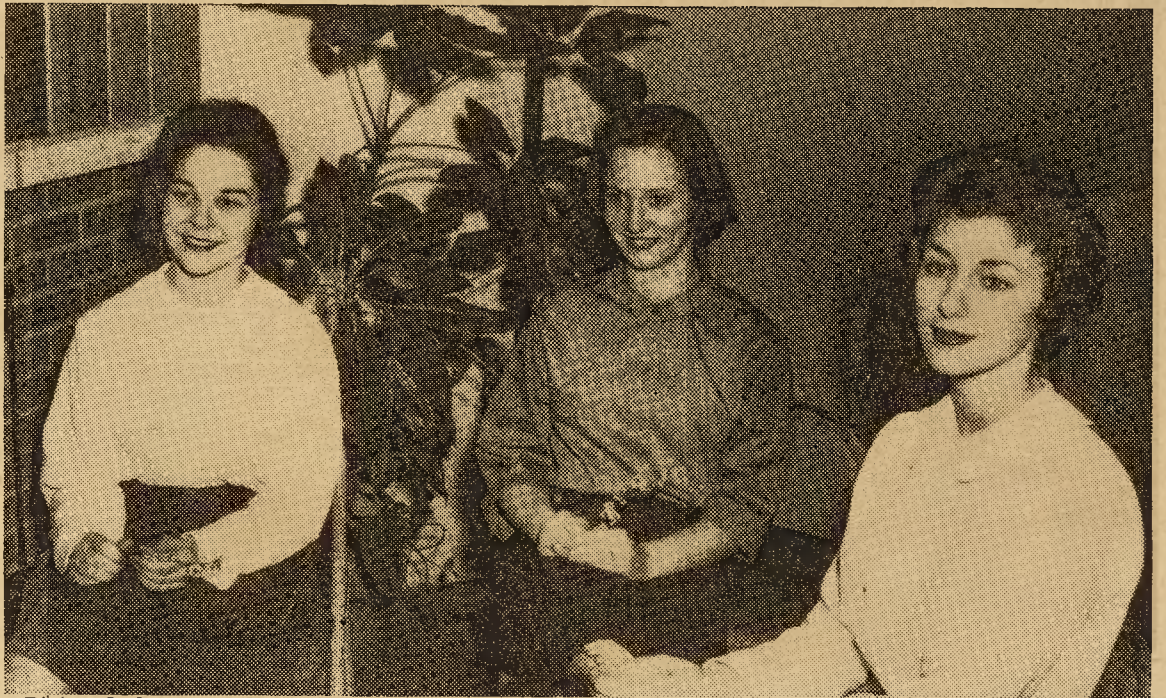
The little surprise attacks such as unexpectedly being between Bessemer and the ball I know made Bessemer wish more and more that she was playing

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# THE ARTS AT SENIOR

Senior High students recently attended two of the most enlightening and inspiring assemblies presented this year.

The music department was in charge of these assemblies. The first was presented by the band and choir, February 28, and the orchestra performed for the sec-

ond, March 7.

The outstanding segment of the band and choir program was the climatic end when the band and choir performed Mr. Thomas Cousins' masterful interpretation of the old Biblical story of *Exodus and Sinai*.

Mr. John Barnes Chance, who was sent to Greensboro for a year by the Ford Foundation to compose for the city schools, wrote the opening piece rendered by the band, *Incantation and Dance*.

Mr. Herbert Hazelman, band director, directed this stirring introduction to a most enjoyable program.

Miss Eula Tuttle's choir never sang more professionally or earnestly. Each member of the choir sang as if his entire life was centered around his music, and the effect was overwhelming.

### Orchestra Program

Equally entertaining was the orchestra program, which opened with a cello solo by Lauren Scott of the Kiser Jr. High orchestra, accompanied on the piano by Dede Kent. Lauren is an eighth grader, and Dede is a ninth grader. Lauren played two movements, *Largo* and *Allegro* from *Sonata Five* by Vivaldi, greatly impressing her high school audience.

Mr. Chance has composed numerous pieces for the orchestra, three of which were played in the assembly. *The Ferocious Fugue*, was the viola's revenge on the violins because the violins usually introduce a number and the violas come in. *The Ferocious Fugue* reverses this arrangement. *Misstep March* and *Fiddlesophy*, also by Mr. Chance, were played, as well as selections by other composers.



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
