
"My family and my dog, Valentine, loved him right away, which is always a good sign."

Zoo animals will provide the theme as they decorate the nursery. Both she and her husband will raise their second child as they have their first, which resembles how their parents raised them.


"In general, when parenting, don't always listen to everyone else's opinions on how a child should be raised.
