of March, and all installations shall take place before the last week in April, unless otherwise specified.

(18) In the event that a Student Government officer or member of a staff of a publication finds it necessary to give up her position or is removed from office, this vacancy shall be filled by the method of elections presented.

Section 2. Point System a. Purpose

The Point System, adopted by the Student Government Association, is enforced to guarantee the participation of a large number of students in college activities. Limitations in the amount of work a student can carry provides for the performance and enrichment of a good program. The basis of these points is the amount of work a position requires.

b. Eligibility:

(1) All students who hold offices on councils of student organizations, the presidents the honorary and social fraternities, the presidents of minor clubs, and the Queen and Maid of Honor of May Court must have a C average with no conditions or failures and must represent in every sense of the word the spirit and ideals of Queens College. These grades will be based upon the work of the previous semester. Students who plan the work of the previous semester. Students who plan to work off conditions and who desire to have their names added to the approved list must notify the Point System Committee at least one week prior to elections.
