of March, and all installations shall take place before the last week in April, unless otherwise specified.

(18) In the event that a Student Government officer or member of a staff of a publication finds it necessary to give up her position or is removed from office, this vacancy shall be filled by the method of elections presented.

Section 2. Point System

a. Purpose

The Point System, adopted by the Student Government Association, is enforced to guarantee the participation of a large number of students in college activities. Limitations in the amount of work a student can carry provides for the performance and enrichment of a good program. The basis of these points is the amount of work a position requires.

b. Eligibility:

(1) All students who hold offices on councils of student organizations, the presidents the honorary and social fraternities, the presidents of minor clubs, and the Queen and Maid of Honor of May Court must have a C average with no conditions or failures and must represent in every sense of the word the spirit and ideals of Queens College. These grades will be based upon the work of the previous semester. Students who plan the work of the previous semester. Students who plan to work off conditions and who desire to have their names added to the approved list must notify the Point System Committee at least one week prior to elections.

(2) The names of all candidates for office or representations of classes must be submitted to the Legislature and Advisory Committee who will pass on their eligibility.

(3) No student may carry more than 26 points.

c. Point System Committee

There shall be a Point System Committee to prepare the approved list of nominees, to consider the evaluation of points and to make changes when necessary; to consider and act upon any cases necessitating any exceptions to the point regulations, to enforce the regulations of the committee, and

to keep a record of the Point System and the students holding positions carrying points.

Note: Any student president may be member ex-officio of Legislative committees without accumulating additional points.

Section 3. Standing Committees

a. The chairmen of the following Standing Committees shall be selected by the Legislature from its own membership:

- (1) Social Committee to plan campus entertainments.
- (2) Chapel and Calendar Committee to regulate chapel conduct, to have announcements made, and to schedule all student meetings.
- (3) Concert and Lecture Series committee to co-operate with faculty committee in selecting lecturers and artists for the following year

and to encourage student attendance.

(4) Recreation Room Committee to be responsible for the care and management of the recreation room.

(5) Point System Committee. The duties of this committee are stated in Section 2.

(6) Budget Committee to prepare a budget for the Student Body for the succeeding school year.

(7) War Service Committee to encourage and direct all campus participation in the war effort.

b. Other standing committees:

(1) Agenda Committee to outline things to be done and the business to be transacted in Legislature meetings. The President of the Student Body, President of the Boarding Student Body, President of the Day Student Body, and the Chairman of Legislature shall be members of this committee.

(2) Ballot Committee to prepare a ballot with three to five suggestions and with provisions for candidates of popular choice for the offices of President of the Student Body, President of the Boarding Student Body, President of the Day Student Body, President of the Student Christian Association, President of the Athletic Association, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer of the Student Body, and members of Honor Council. The outgoing President and Vice-President of the Student Body and Presidents of the Boarding Student Body, Day Student Body, Student Christian Association and Athletic Association shall be members of this committee.
