Who's Who is a national honorary organization to which over 600 American colleges and universities elect representatives. The number of representatives to be elected is determined by the enrollment of the institution.

The purpose of Who's Who is to serve as an incentive to students for getting the most out of their careers, as a means of compensation to students for what they have done, as a standard of measurement for students, and as a recommendation of students to the business world.

Character, scholarship, leadership in extra-curricular activities, and potentiality for future usefulness to business and society are requisites for membership. Queens is proud that six of its student body have more than amply met these requirements.
