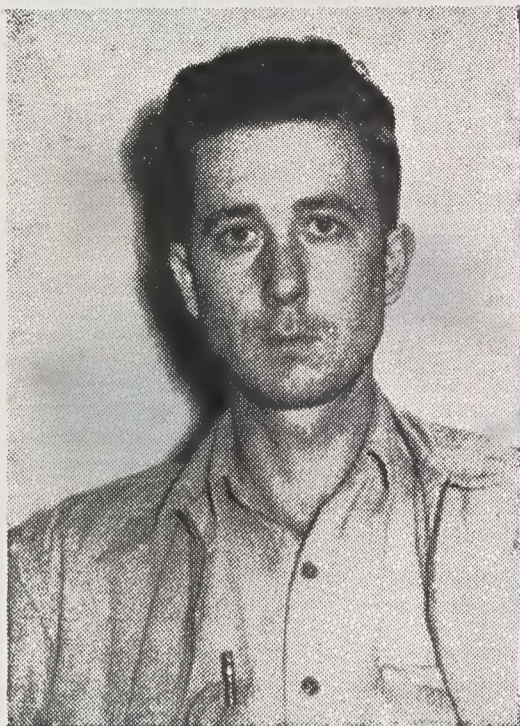


People You Know
