Honor Graduate

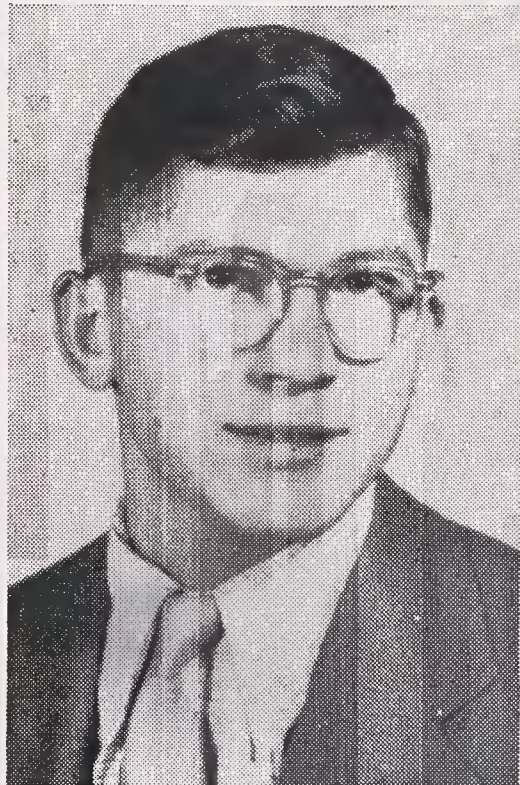
