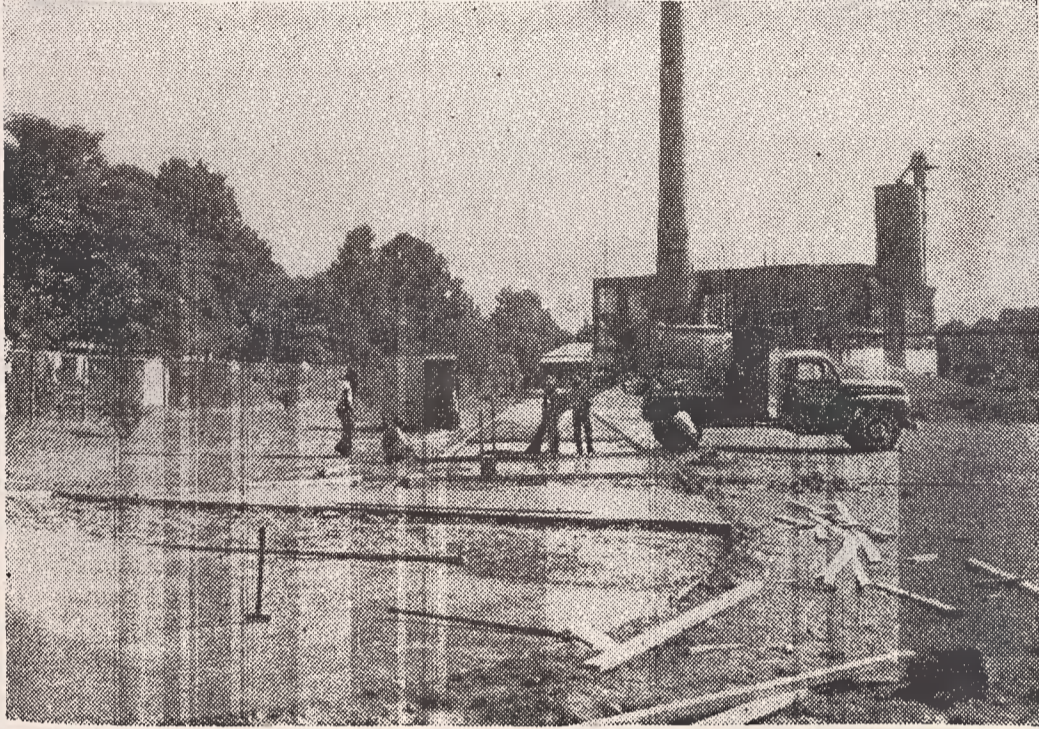

New Gateways Open To Elm Street



Two new gateways have been installed giving access for entrance and exit on West Elm Street. These gateways are joined by a 14' x 741' long concrete roadway. The area around the frame repair building and the rear of the boiler plant will also be covered with concrete. One of the main purposes of this new construction is to provide easier access to the frame repair building and boiler plant area. It also connects with our present shipping road and can be used in conjunction with this.

Films To Be Shown
