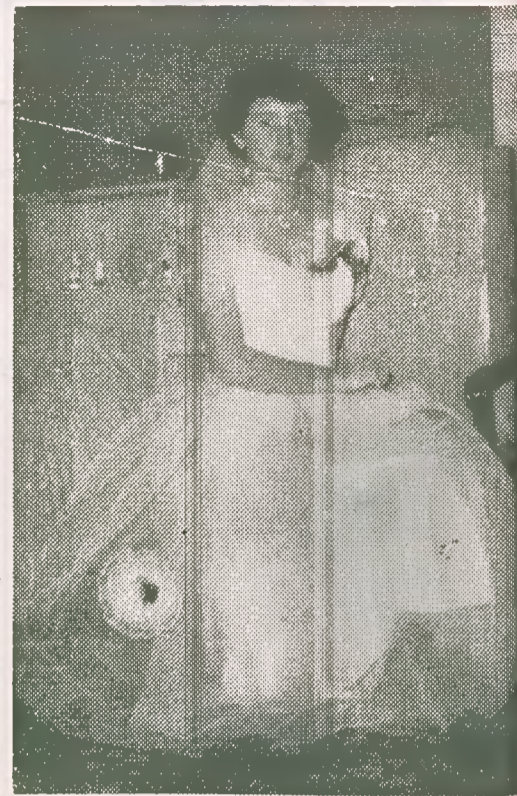
Elon College
