Carl Schilkowsky has been appointed manager of the Technical Control Department, which has begun operation in its new location at the Caromount plant.

Mr. Schilkowsky, a graduate of Harvard, began his employment with the Shelton division in July, 1936, in the printing department. He also worked in the chemistry and dye laboratory.

From 1942 to 1946 Schilkow-ky was serving in the U. S. Army Medical Corps in the medical laboratory. He was in New Guinea 20 months. When he left the Army he returned to this company as a chemist in the Shelton Research Department in February, 1946, where he remained until his promotion to Manager of Control Department and transfer to the Caromount Division.

Mr. Schilkowsky has been a member of the American Association of Textile Chemists and Colorists, having served as Vice Chairman of the western New England section of this association.

Schilkowsky is a native of Shelton. Connecticut. Plans are being completed for Mrs. Schilkowsky and their son, Carl, Jr., to establish their residence in Rocky Mount at an early date. Mrs. Schilkowsky is a native of Bryson City, N. C.

Frank Pelters has transferred to Caromount to conduct the sample dyeing in the Control Department. Mr. Pelters is an uncle of H. W. Rotters of Caromount, Dyeing Dept. He began his employment with the Company in April, 1913, as a dyer. He is a member of the Shelton Looms Service Club.
