Out Sick

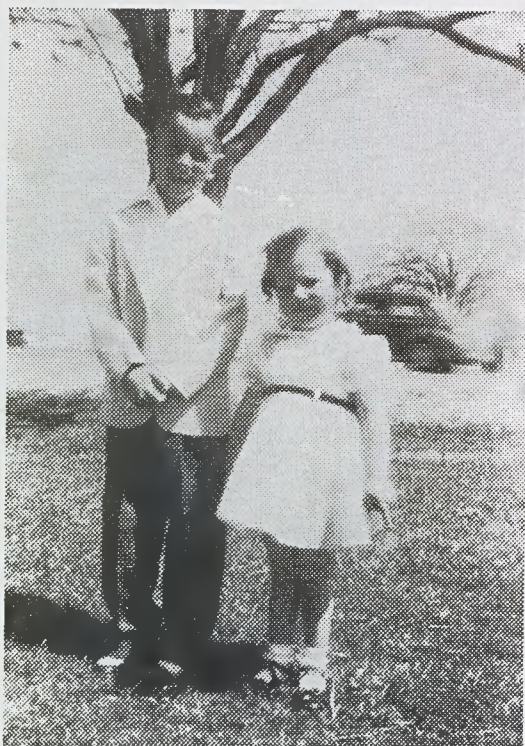
Ruby Williams and Dora Pridgen are out sick.
