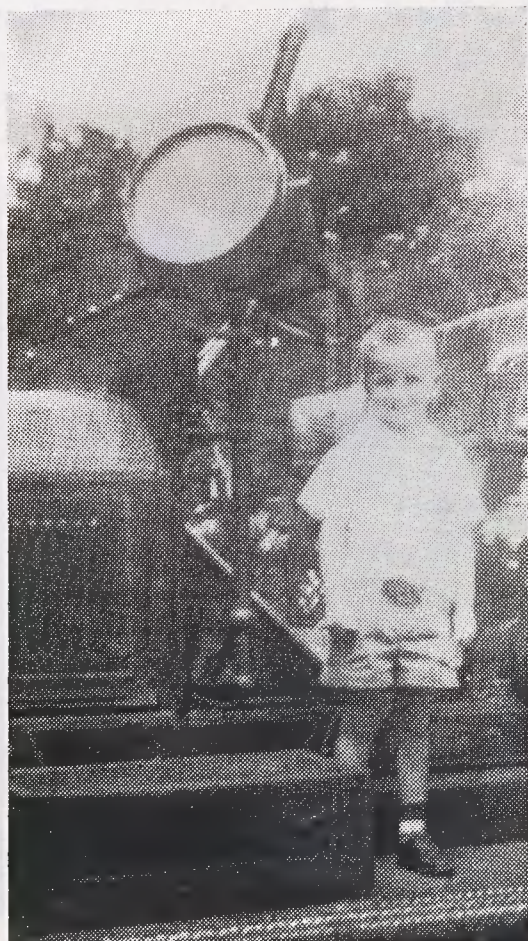

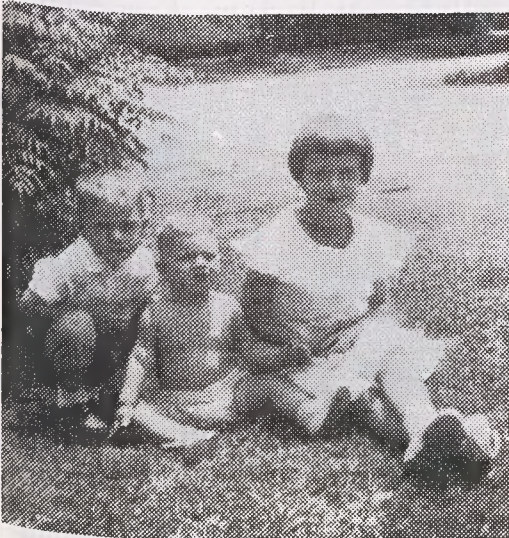

A/3c Herman Stancil spent the weekend at home with his mother, Mrs. Naomi Stancil.



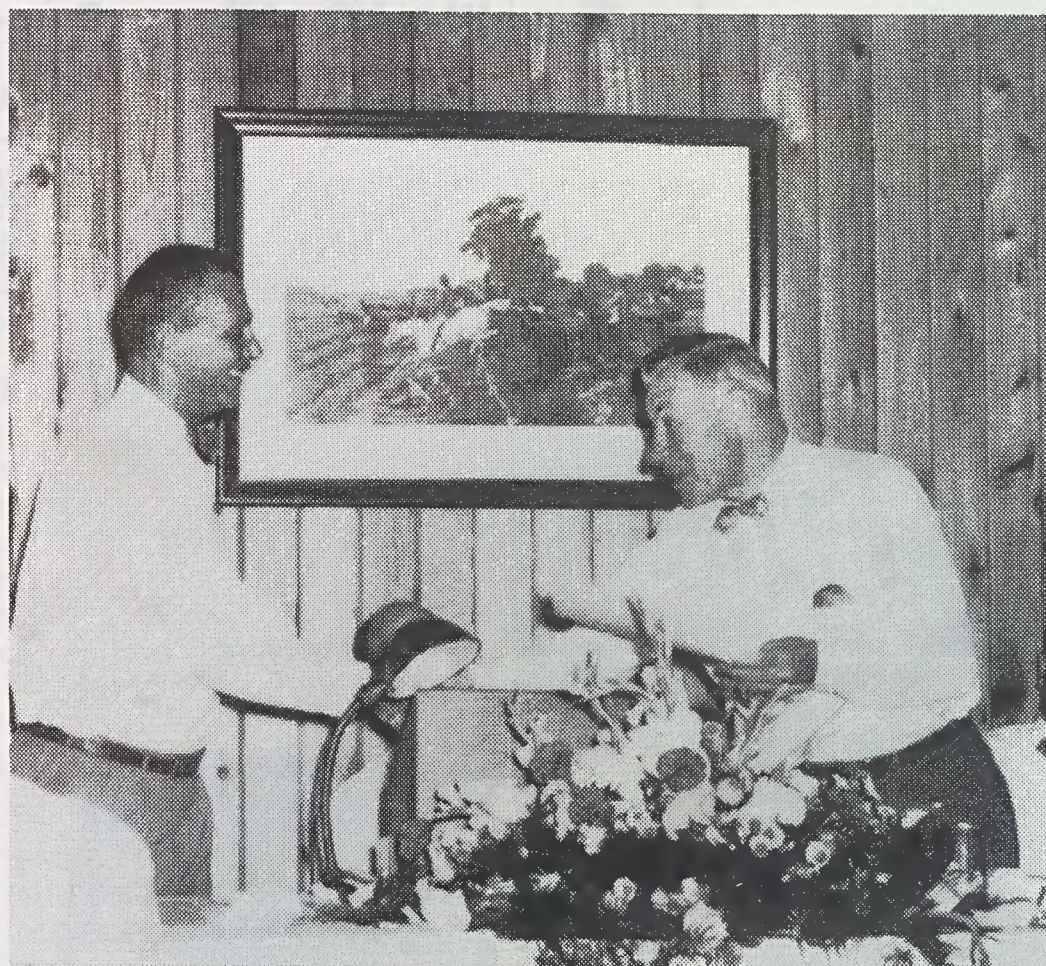

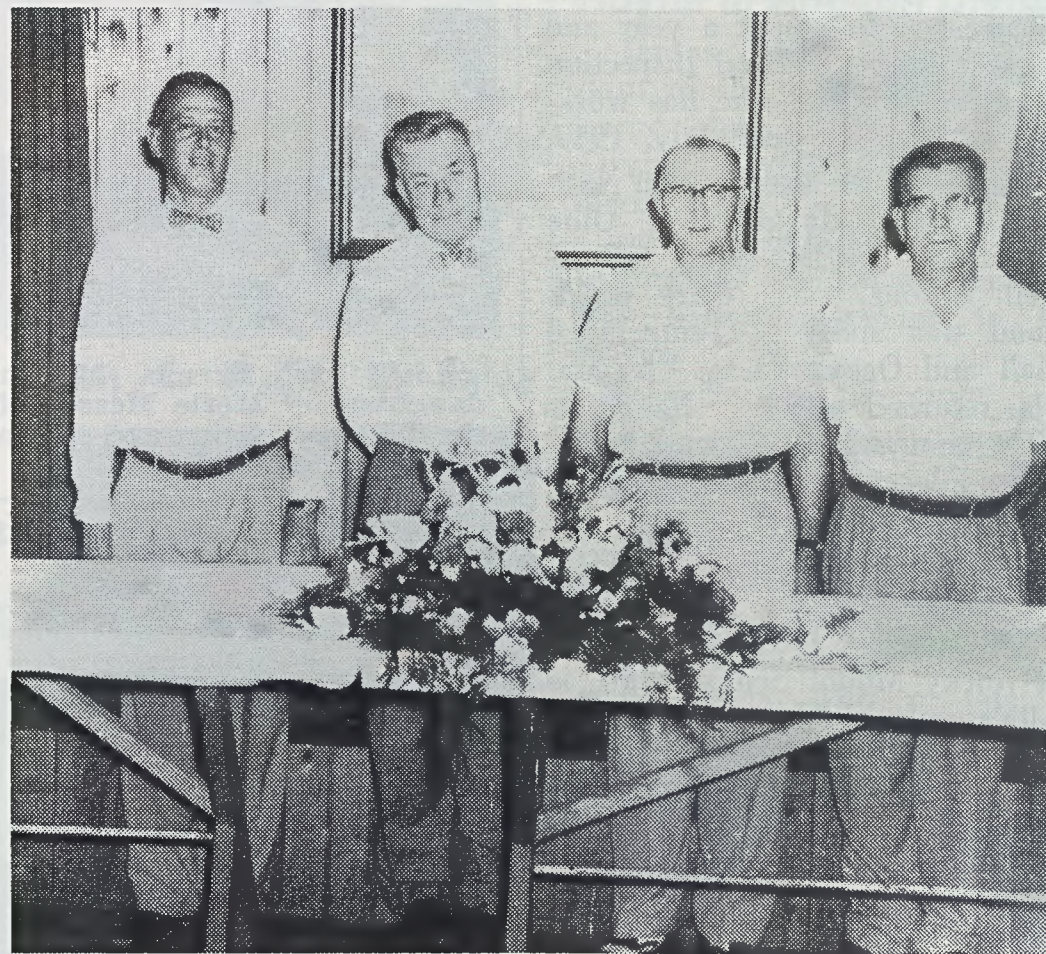
