### At Ocean View

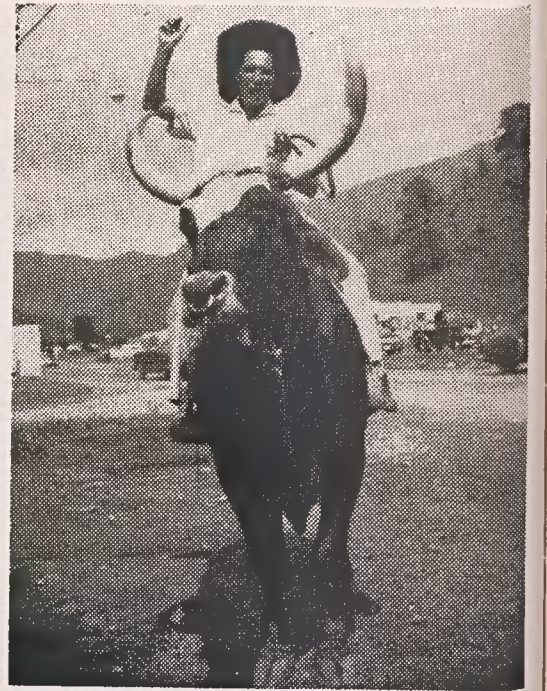
Mrs. Juanita Mattox and family spent a few days in Norfolk and Ocean View.

### At Rest Haven

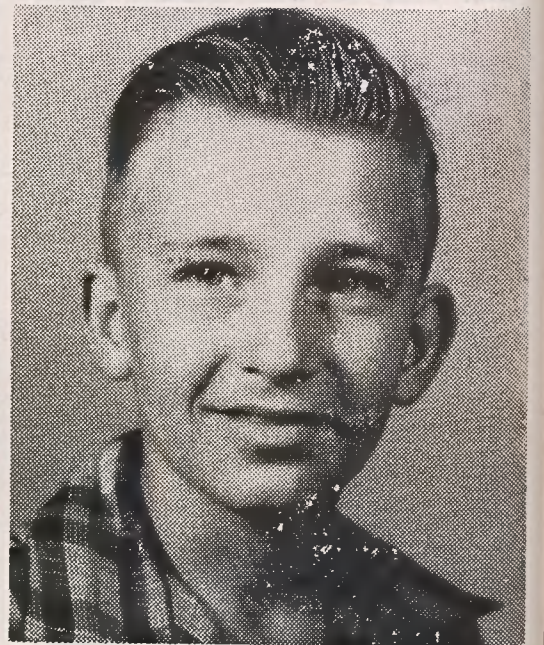

### Mountain Trip

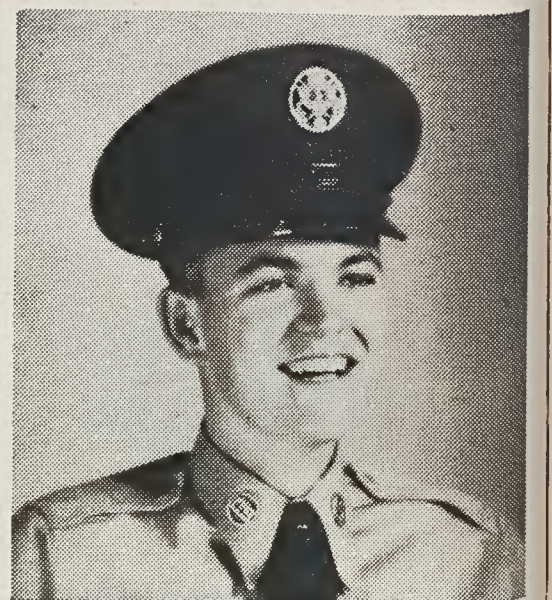
Mrs. Bertha Williams and friends traveled through the mountains of western North Carolina during her vacation.
